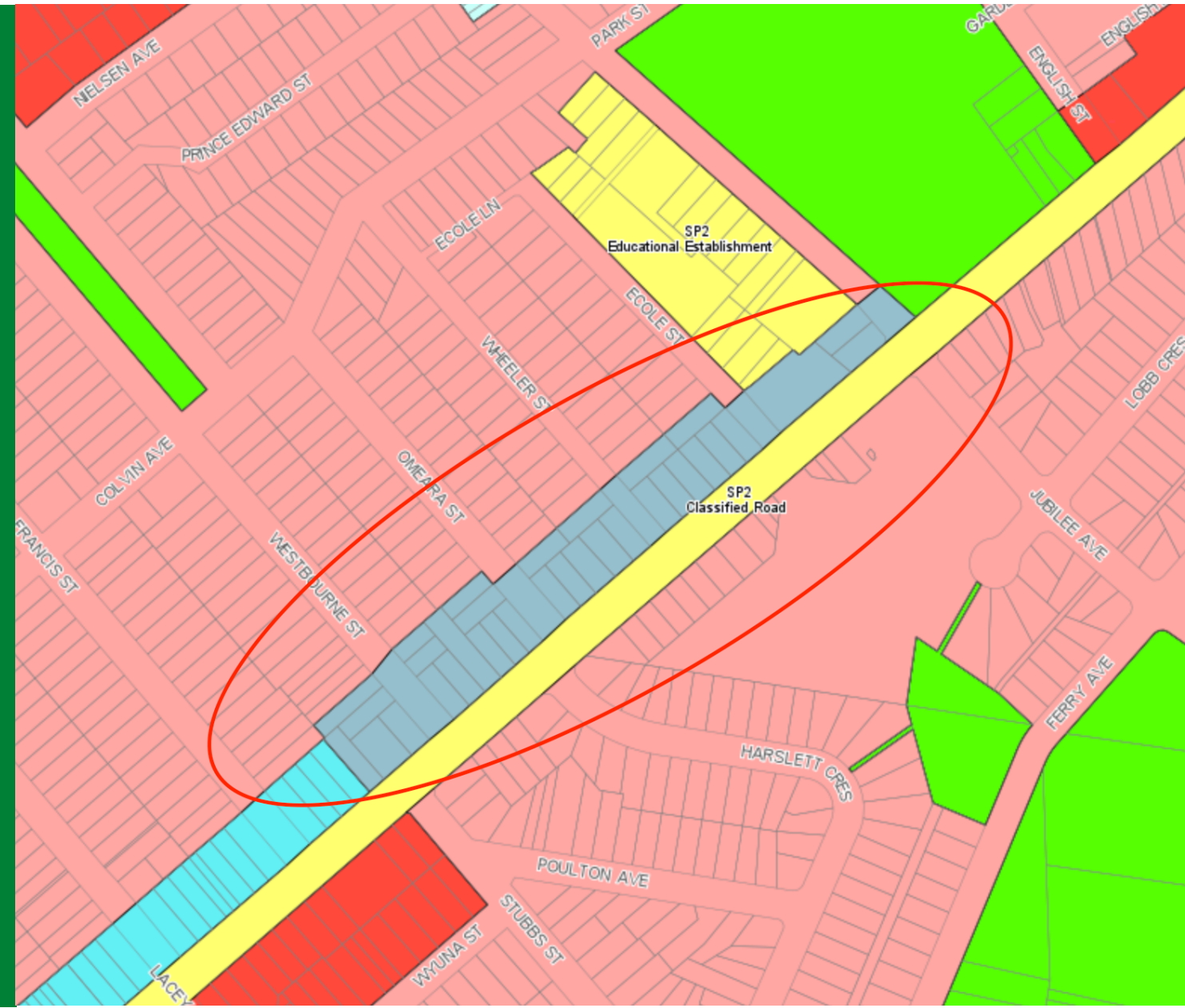


No Function Centres and Small Bars in the B6-Enterprise Corridor Zone



Georges River Council, in their Draft Local Environmental Plan (LEP) 2020, are proposing to change the permitted use to the B6-Enterprise Corridor zone to **permit Function Centres and Small Bars**.

The Kogarah Bay Progress Association objects to the proposed change which would allow function centres and small bars (up to 60 people). These uses would generate excess noise in an area surrounded by low-density residential dwellings.

If you oppose the proposed change to the permitted use in the B6 Enterprise Corridor, we encourage you to write a submission to Georges River Council, outlining your concerns and requesting Council **delete 'Function Centres and Small Bars Entertainment facilities from the permitted uses in the B6 Enterprise Corridor Zone**.
